Rachael Louise Snyder has written for the *New York Times Magazine*, *Slate*, *Glamour*, *Jane*, *Salon*, and the *New Republic* and is a regular contributor to National Public Radio's *Marketplace*, *This American Life*, and *All Things Considered*. Her latest book, *Fugitive Denim: A Moving Story of People and Pants in the Borderless World of Global Trade*, is a compelling narrative that focuses on a familiar

niche of the clothing universe: that icon of Americana, the denim cloth of blue jeans.

The multibillion dollar textile industry is perhaps the world's best barometer of globalization's effects – both nefarious and beneficial. After all, everyone has to get dressed in the morning, and that means they need clothes – clothes that are usually made in far-off countries, under the auspices of a rapidly changing cluster of trade agreements and quota treaties. *Fugitive Denim* travels up and down the rag trade's food chain, from dingy offices in Azerbaijan to hip Manhattan lofts; and from the dimming industrial heartland of Italy to an unexpectedly modern garment factory in China. A chapter of the book aired on *This American Life* recently won the Overseas Press Award. Snyder's book will be available for purchase and signing following the program. THE SPIRIT OF DEMOCRACY

with Larry Diamond, senior fellow, Hoover Institution



In 1974, nearly three-quarters of all countries were dictatorships; today, more than half are democracies. Leading democracy expert Larry Diamond contends, however, that recent efforts to promote democracy around the world have stumbled and many democratic governments are faltering. Exploring how and why democracy progresses, Diamond maintains that the desire for

democracy runs deep, even in very poor countries, and that even countries with entrenched regimes like Iran and China could become democracies within a generation.

Diamond is a senior fellow at the Hoover Institution, coeditor of the *Journal of Democracy*, and codirector of the International Forum for Democratic Studies at the National Endowment for Democracy. He is also a professor and coordinator of the Democracy Program at the Center on Democracy, Development, and the Rule of Law at Stanford University. Diamond's new book, *The Spirit of Democracy: The Struggle to Build Free Societies Throughout the World*, will be available for purchase and signing at the program.
